

Reminders To Veterans

- For veterans who need more help at home, there's a "hidden benefit" known as the Veteran-Directed Care Program. Veterans participating in this program are able to hire family and friends to provide for their personal care needs – or to provide support to their family caregivers. It authorizes a monthly flexible spending budget.
- For long-term care, the Aid and Attendance benefit is aimed at helping older veterans and their spouses when they can no longer handle daily living tasks, such as dressing and showering, on their own.
